

## 2009 Highlights

- Debbie May-Johnson began as the new Executive Director in May of 2009 after former Director Lee Williams left to pursue a position with the United States Committee for Refugees and Immigrants (USCRI).
- The Refugee Resettlement Department resettled 413 refugees in 2009.
- The Language Bank handled 302 translation and 2,918 non-refugee interpreting requests from various sectors of the community. The other Communications Programs (interpreter training, cultural competence training and cultural referrals) served 640 individuals in 2009.
- In 2009, the Immigration Counseling Department served 4,639 people. 49 people became new U.S. Citizens at the IIA's Citizenship Ceremony in June funded by the Knight Foundation American Dream Fund. In November, the IIA partnered with the USCIS Cleveland Field Office and held a Citizenship Open House.
- The English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) Program served 1,114 individuals in 2009.
- The Financial Literacy Program assisted 382 men and women and was funded by the United Way and the Women's Endowment Fund.
- The IIA held its annual fundraising auction event "One World, Many Cultures" at the Akron Zoo on August 28, 2009. 150 people attended the event that raised over \$16,500.
- The 2009 Dora Gordon Scholarship was awarded to Abraham Zabay .

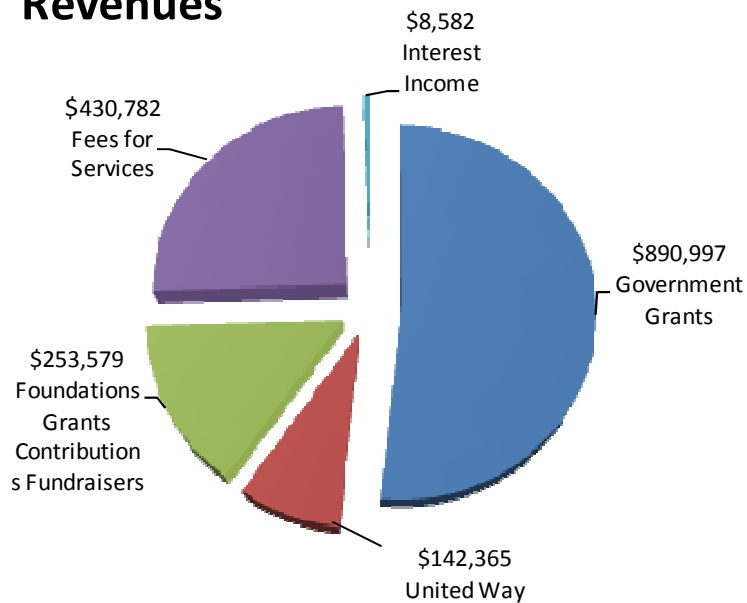

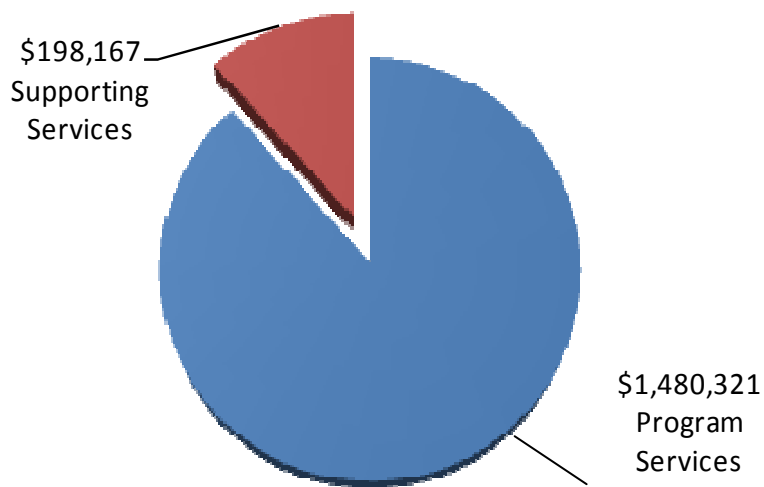
